






INDEPENDENCE DAY

24 participants participated in the event out of which 15 were female participants. All the participants got a certificate on completion of the process.










WORLD PHOTOGRAPHY DAY




RUN4UNITY


POSTER MAKING


HINDI DIWAS




TARANG - SEPT'21


GANDHI JAYANTI






WORLD MENTAL HEALTH DAY

WORLD STUDENTS' DAY


October 15, 2021


SLOGAN WRITING EVENT

13 Volunteers out of which 10 were female volunteers wrote beautiful slogans and it was a decent event.






SARDAR VALLABHBHAI PATEL'S BIOGRAPHY

CORRUPTION -TARANG ROUND 1


October 29, 2021

Volunteers remembered their freedom fighters with love and respect. 15 Volunteers actively participated in the event out of which 8 were female volunteers.






PLEDGE TAKING

48 Volunteers participated in the event out of which 31 were female volunteers.




INTRA-COLLEGE DIGITAL POSTER MAKING COMPETITION

19 volunteers participated out of which 13 were female volunteers.






NATIONAL CANCER AWARENESS DAY

This session was open for all. Around 40 participants were their in this webinar out of which 26 were female volunteers.




PREAMBLE READING

18 volunteers participated out of which 13 were female volunteers.






HUMAN RIGHTS DAY






YOUTH AIRNXt





NATIONAL ENERGY CONSERVATION DAY

26 Volunteers actively participated out of which 18 were female volunteers in this activity and the event turned out to be an overall success. Glimpses of the event are in the slides.







NATIONAL KISAN DIWAS

Total 13 participants participated out of which 6 were female vounteers.




TARANG DEC'21


December 31, 2021

The event got a plethora of responses from 211 participants, of which 120 were female volunteers. We cherish the zeal and devotion of all our volunteers.







ORIENTATION PROGRAM ON 75TH ARMY DAY

"This National Girl Child Day, be proud of a girl child. They are the ones who are made up of courage, determination, sacrifice, commitment, talent and love."









ORIENTATION PROGRAM





WORLD CANCER AWARENESS DAY


WORLD PEACE AND UNDERSTANDING DAY

February 28, 2022




INTERNATIONAL WOMEN'S DAY

The Session witnessed participation of more than 134 volunteers, out of which 78 were female volunteers who all joined the meeting and made it a very successful one.






SHAHEED DIWAS

A total of 88 volunteers participated in the event, out of which 47 were female volunteers.






SHAHEED DIWAS

This along with mental preparation provided us the students to face offline exams after a huge gap confidently!




POSHAN PAKHWADA


BLOOD DONATION CAMP

26 volunteers actively participated in this out of which 19 were female.






CLIMATE CHANGE & ENVIRONMENTALLY GEARED ECONOMICS


AIDS VACCINE DAY


THE NATIONAL ENDANGERED SPECIES DAY





INTERNATIONAL OLYMPIC DAY




PLASTIC AWARENESS DRIVE DAY 1 - POSTER MAKING


PLASTIC AWARENESS DRIVE DAY 5 - IN LOCALITY

July 16, 2022


