15. Multidisciplinary / interdisciplinary

The four year Undergraduate Curriculum Framework UGCF-2022 based on NEP2020 has been introduced in session 2022-23. A committee at college level was constituted for smooth implementation of UGCF 2022 at the college. Also faculty have been made nodal officers to address students queries and coordinate at university level. multidisciplinary curriculum with a vision to equip the students with knowledge on other fields of interest besides their core subjects. This ultidisciplinary curriculum also allows different exit options at the conclusion of first, second, and third years of undergraduate study. College offered wide choices (12-14) of Skill enhancement (SEC), generic elective (GE), value added (VAC) and ability enhancement (AEC) courses to students in I and II semester. These courses can be studied by students across all streams promote multidisciplinary learning. The faculty members from different departments also are working together sharing their knowledge and expertise to develop a holistic approach. College besides offering Hindi as AEC language, has also become part of cluster of colleges to offer other Indian language options to students. Environmental Science and Indian languages has been offered to all students.

16.Academic bank of credits (ABC):

Academic Bank of Credits" (ABC) as part of efforts to transform the education system as per the National Education Policy (NEP) is a digital storehouse that will keep records the credits earned by students during their learning journey. It will allow students to open their accounts and enables them to transfer credits seamlessly embracing a multi-disciplinary educational approach. RLA college adheres to the rules and regulations set by the University of Delhi when designing curricula for various courses and transferring credits. The decision to collaborate with foreign institutes and offer joint degrees is also determined by the statutes of the University of Delhi and its Academic Council. RLA college as per the directives of the University of Delhi, is already on board with the concept of ABC. The ABC tab has been created in student login portal. 17.Skill development:

The college has offered wide choices (12-14 per semester) to students for skill enhancement courses in consultation with faculty of each department. The students can also undertake Internship, Apprenticeship and Community Outreach (IAC) in lieu of skill enhancement courses for which college has received guidelines from university and is in the process to apply the same in college. This provide students a valuable opportunity to apply their knowledge, develop skills, enhance their employability, and become well-rounded individuals capable of making a positive impact society. The college has initiated the process for approval to develop a skill centre at the college. The College has decided to collaborate with higher educational institutions (HEIs) andNational Skill Development Council (NSDC) and its associated councils to run various skill development courses for the students of Ram Lal Anand College and from outside. In addition, the College will also initiate short-term training courses under Pradhan Mantri Kaushal Vikas Yojana (PMKVY) scheme. Facilities like Computer and Microbiology Laboratories are being made available for extended hours to the students enrolled in the above skill development courses. A language Laboratory is going to be established to improve the communication skills of the college students. Soft skill courses are being offered through career and placement cell of the college. In addition, the College sanctions Summer Research Projects to provide hands on training and research exposure to a large number of students. Besides, University of Delhi's new Scheme, Competence Enhancement Scheme (CES) to be launched in 2023-24 will also make higher education more accessible and impart skills, as envisaged under the NEP 2020. This Scheme shall provide opportunities to people from all walks of life to enhance their knowledge/competence by registering for courses being offered in the Colleges as per their requirement. The students also gain skills through industrial and field visits being regularly organised by the college.

18.Appropriate integration of Indian Knowledge system (teaching in Indian Language, culture, using online course)

The Indian Knowledge System, emphasis on cultural enrichment, profoundly influences students exposing them to India's rich heritage. This cultivates a sense of identity and pride, instilling in students a connection to their roots. RLA College offers several courses for example, Yoga: Philosophy and Practice,' and 'Culture and Communication' to foster traditional Indian knowledge systems and to enhance Indian language proficiency. Moreover, the several societies, and Spic Macay RLA chapter, promote understanding of

India's rich cultural heritage in the spirit of NEP. Yoga workshops and competitions are regularly held for both students and staff. The institutional faculty also provides bilingual education in class room delivery and this is further being expanded. The faculty and students are being oriented for integration of Indian Knowledge system through various seminar /webinar , competitions and other events being held in college and universities

19. Focus on Outcome based education (OBE): Focus on Outcome based education (OBE):

Outcome-Based Education (OBE) a student-centric approach has been adopted in course structure, lesson plan, delivery, and assessments. It is ensured that the stated objectives and outcomes are achieved. College promotes faculty's participation in orientation programs/, seminars, workshops to imbibe the essence of outcome based learning. The CO, PO, PSO are stated course curriculum which have been designed in consultation with faculty of different colleges. The college regularly upgrades ICT facilities to facilitate innovative teaching and assessments. The college encourages students to participate in add on skill development certificate courses, seminars, field trips, industrial visits, internships, to gain practical experience.

20.Distance education/online education:

The College conducts certificate courses, webinars through online mode. The students are encouraged learning in blended mode by attending MOOCs courses in NPTEL, SWAYAM, Coursera platforms. The college has MoU with Virtual Labs, IIT for practical's and with ICT academy for advanced trainings/ workshops. College signed MoU with IGNOU recently this year to establish a learning support centre at RLA college for BSc Geology, PG diploma and certificate course in disaster management and a certificate course in geoinformatics.

1.1 - Curricular Planning and Implementation

1.1.1 - The Institution ensures effective curriculum delivery through a well planned and documented process

The college prioritizes a robust curriculum delivery system, meticulously aligning with the University of Delhi's schedule. Through a transparent process, workload distribution is planned and approved, with additional teachers appointed accordingly. The timetable committee, allocates time for classes, mentor-mentee sessions and prominently displays on website/ classroom/notices, and college boards. The college kickstarts effective learning environment with online orientation program, Strong teacherstudent interaction emphasized through comprehensive departmental orientation programs, informing students about the college activities. Academic Affairs Committee, IQAC, and Principal ensures teaching and curriculum adherence, and corrective measures implemented. Faculty employ diverse teaching methods, chalk and talk, presentations, bilingual lectures, videos, film screenings, casestudies, group discussions, theatre adaptations, peerlearning, and role-play. The department diligently adheres to prescribed dates for classes and continuous evaluation (tests,

presentations, quizzes, and vivas). To enhance curriculum delivery audio books have been created and shared on website for students with special needs, bilingual lectures, discussing previous years' question papers, and translating syllabi into Hindi. Value Addition Courses, projects based on field trips and heritage walks enrich the learning experience. Remote access to online learning resources facilitated through INFLIBNET and NLIST, encouraging advanced learners to engage in research. Faculty ensure timely syllabus completion, doubt-clearing sessions, and remedial classes.

1.1.2 - The institution adheres to the academic calendar including for the conduct of Continuous Internal Evaluation (CIE)

The academic calendar precisely outlines the dates for semesterend theory and practical examinations, with departments providing students tentative dates for internal evaluations. Faculty members develop comprehensive lesson plans for their courses, while the IQAC oversees these activities. In adherence to the University's guidelines, Practical Examinations (experiments and attendance) account for 50% of marks, and Theory Internal Examinations (via Attendance, Class Tests, Assignments, etc.) contribute 25% for each semester under the Comprehensive Continuous Evaluation (CCE) system. Question papers for internal exams are prepared by the respective faculties. The teachers in charge within each department monitor course coverage, student attendance, and assignments, collaborating with the concerned faculty. Remedial classes are provided for students with low scores in internal tests. Internal assessment records, including test and assignment marks, are shared with students according to the schedule. The

Internal Assessment Monitoring Committee promptly addresses any grievances within the stipulated timeframe, both before and after uploading to the university portal.

Various platforms, including mock parliaments and Model United Nations, stimulate student engagement in these critical discussions. The English Department's curriculum, including GE papers and skill enhancement courses, addresses prevalent issues like gender disparity, class inequality, racism, casteism, and other oppressive social structures. The college's commitment to these principles extends beyond academics, with initiatives like an international conference on sustainable Geotourism and courses related to Swatch Bharat, yoga, ethics, and environmental studies. The integration of these cross-cutting issues across disciplines reflects the college's dedication to nurturing socially responsible, ethically aware, and environmentally conscious individuals.

Tutorial sessions identify learning gaps and provide targeted support. Mentor-mentee interactions, both formal and informal, play a crucial role in identifying individual needs. Remedial classes are conducted after covering the syllabus, accompanied by shared lecture notes and course materials. Informal interactions include face-to-face discussions, social media engagement, and phone conversations to gauge the students' progress. Advanced learners are encouraged to lead group projects and involve in research endeavors, extending their learning beyond regular classes. They are motivated to participate in certificate courses from platforms like Coursera, NPTEL, supplementary reading material through platforms like Shodhganga enhancing their academic portfolio. In case of subpar performance or absenteeism, parents are promptly informed, fostering a collaborative approach to student success. The institution promotes collaboration between advanced and slower learners, facilitating mutually benefiting learning experiences. The faculty, acting as mentors, closely monitor academic performance and address any challenges hindering students learning. The institution's commitment to individualized learning ensures a supportive environment that nurtures the diverse needs of both advanced and slower learners.

The UGCF curriculumframework crafted with a student-centric ethos, offers a diverse array of courses, fostering creative combinations across disciplines, placing a significant emphasis on research, skill development, higher-order thinking, actively promoting innovation and employability. To enhance the learning experience, faculty employs a range of student-centric teaching methods, include case studies, documentary screenings, role-playing, theatrical methods, enactments, Model United Nations conferences, Mock Parliament sessions, project-based learning, class discussions, tutorials, presentations, personal counselling, videos and virtual labs. Departments organize seminars, conferences, and hands-on workshops, featuring experts from diverse fields sharing their insights. The Students are encouraged to explore a wealth of e-journals from databases such as EPW, JSTOR, NCBI, and E-Gyankosh, accessible through the University of Delhi e-library. Google Classroom serves as a central hub for teachers to manage eresources, assignments, tests, and evaluations. Various tools such as White Board, Jam Board, One Note, Recorded Video lectures, and pen tablets are being effectively employed. Computer labs are equipped with updated software, including HNC hardware, Matlab, Mathematica, LateX, Turbo C++, Dev C++, and R. Additionally, opensource bioinformatics software and databases contribute to the teaching process. Some departments use documentaries pertaining to the topics. Platforms like Smarthistory, that has evolved into a widely used, free online multimedia introductory textbook is being used for history. databases Artstor, Google Art Project, image and architecture viewers like Wölff and Google Streetview, and technologies like virtual reality and 3D printing are also connecting students with works cloistered in faraway museums to a degree that was once impossible. Faculty members actively engage in continuous learning, participating in ICT trainings. The college facilitates laptop issuance and zoom subscribed for large meetings. 2.5 - Evaluation Process and Reforms

2.5.1 - Mechanism of internal assessment is transparent and robust in terms of frequency and mode. Write description within 200 words.

The college has established a comprehensive internal assessment and evaluation system to gauge students' progress. Various assessment methods, including class tests, quizzes, MCQ-based tests, mock practical, OBE, tests, group viva, assignments, presentations, and field report analysis, are employed. Active participation in these activities is expected from students to ensure a thorough assessment. Internal assessment, accounting for 25% of the total marks in each paper, is an ongoing process encompassing attendance, assignments, and tests, with the following weightage: Assignment - 10%, Tests - 10%, Attendance -5%. To uphold transparency and efficiency, students receive timely information regarding the dates and timings of units to be covered in class tests and assignments through notices/whatsapp groups. Regular review meetings within departments aim to standardize assessment practices across departments and faculties. These meetings discuss assessment modalities and marking criteria. Following the evaluation of assignments and class tests, teachers discuss with students andaddress their queries. A Departmental Moderation Committee ensures a final review of the assessment conducted by individual faculty members. Subsequently, the College's Internal Assessment Monitoring Committee oversees the uploading of all internal assessment marks onto the university portal and website and shares with students. The committee promptly addresses any student grievances related to it. This structured approach ensures a fair and transparent evaluation process.

At the onset of each semester, all faculty members diligently formulate comprehensive lesson plans outlining tentative dates/weeks for assignments, tests, and presentations, ensuring timely communication to students. Rigorous testing procedures, encompass multiple tests, assignments, and viva in each course. Following assessments, faculty members discuss test papers with students, addressing any queries and providing explanations for variations in marks to ensure student satisfaction. The final IA marks, are presented to students for verification, accompanied by their signatures. Subsequently, faculty members submit these marks to the head of the department, who convenes a meeting of the Departmental Moderation Committee for a thorough review. The moderated marks, along with the minutes of the moderation committee, are forwarded to the IA Monitoring Committee through a dedicated email address. The committee uploads the marks on the university portal, making them accessible to students via the college website (https://rlacollege.edu.in/internalassessment.php).A reasonable window is provided for students to scrutinize the internal assessment marks and report any discrepancies to the Internal Assessment Monitoring Committee for necessary action. Any errors identified at this stage are meticulously addressed by the Internal Assessment Committee and/or the Grievance Committee on a case-by-case basis, after a thorough examination of raw data records, ensuring suitable resolution. Furthermore, certain programs, involve practicals and projects, contributing a total of 50 marks. In accordance with university provisions, 25 marks are allocated for Continuous Internal Evaluation, considering students' attendance, performance in practicals/projects, and the preparation of records/reports.

Another industrial visit was organised for the students to BIONEST to show startups. We have established links with BioNEST-UDSC, RCB and FIIT, IIT Delhi incubator, hosting trainings/seminars on entrepreneurship.Research infrastructure has been bolstered through college and extramural grants from organizations such as ICMR, DBT, and ICSSR. The college has formulated a comprehensive research policy, actively encouraging and financially supporting faculty members to guide research projects. The enrolment of students pursuing Ph.D. programs is steadily increasing. Social entrepreneurship is being promoted through Enactus.

In alignment with the NEP 2020, the college implemented UGCF curriculum in 2022-23. College has a public address system, seminar hall with seating capacity of 70-75, two amphitheatres accommodating up to 120 individuals each, conference room, and A/V studio.Smartboards have been installed in 10 classroom/labs. Faculty have access to three separaterooms for reading/meetings, and a large staff room equipped with desktops and printer. Campus is completely Wi-Fi enabled. The expansive library covers an area of 1500 sq. meters, accommodating up to 120 students with over 41 journals, 14 magazines, Hindi and English newspapers, and around 64936 books. It is well-equipped with modern amenities such as Kindle readers, six web-connected laptops, six Daisy Players, and a KIBO Multilingual Keyboard Scanner & Reading Companion for visually challenged students. A dedicated reading room, equipped with Braille books, laptops, and specialized software to assist differently-abled students and faculty The library is digitally connected through INFLIBNET and N-LIST, and it subscribes to Sugam Pustakalaya to support visually impaired students. More than two lakh books are available on Kindle

devices. The college started a unique venture in the form of community radio station at the frequency 90.0 FM known as Radio TARANG being the first in any college in Delhi University.

The college places a strong emphasis on the holistic development of its students, offering a comprehensive range of facilities and activities. There is a spacious playfield which has been redeveloped this year and an indoor sports facility to cater to physical well-being. Active NCC and NSS units contribute to community engagement activities. The college promotes mental wellbeing through the Yoga and Meditation Committee, which organizes workshops and competitions for both students and staff. A variety of extracurricular and co-curricular activities, such as music, dance, drama, nukkad natak, debate, quiz, painting, music, photography, and film screenings, talks by eminent personalities are facilitated through vibrant societies. The college has two amphitheaters with a projection screen and wall-mounted LCD projector, accommodating 120 individuals for society events/seminar. The front lawns serve as a versatile space for larger gatherings. The seminar room, with a seating capacity of 75, is utilized for smaller events. Diversifying its offerings, the college is developing a studio theatre in a large hall, supported by funds of 45 lacs received from the Ministry of Culture. Furthermore, a fully equipped audio-video media production center, featuring state-of-the-art cameras, microphones, mixers, and recording devices, and community radio station provides practical training to studentsand as a means for outreach. Another activity centre for regular Yoga sessions for both students and faculty is under development and should be functional soon.

4.2.1 - Library is automated using Integrated Library Management System (ILMS)

The college boasts a fully air-conditioned library spanning 1500

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square meters, with a dedicated reading space of 500 square meters for students. Within this space, 50 square meters are allocated for teaching staff, and an additional 50 square meters cater to differently-abled individuals. The library accommodates a total of 120 individuals, providing individual reading carrels, a lounge area for browsing and relaxed reading, and an IT zone for accessing e-resources. The library is equipped with ILMS: TRODDON Software, FULLY AUTOMATED Version: 5.6.0216. All books are barcoded with ILMS, and an OPAC system facilitates easy access and location of books. With a collection of over sixty-three thousand books, the library subscribes to more than 41 journals and 14 newspapers in both Hindi and English. It features 8 Kindle readers, 6 web-connected laptops, and 2 desktops specifically equipped with software for differently-abled individuals. Additionally, there are 6 Daisy Players and a KIBO Multilingual Keyboard Scanner & Reading Companion for visually challenged students. Digital connectivity is ensured through INFLIBNET and N-List, and the library recently acquired an annual membership to Sugam Pustakalaya for visually impaired students. For differentlyabled students and faculty, a fully functional dedicated reading room is available, stocked with books in Braille, laptops, and software tailored for the visually impaired. Library funds are allocated based on decisions made in library committee meetings, directing resources toward the purchase of periodicals, journals, books, newspapers, and magazines.

The college has instituted a comprehensive policy to efficiently manage and utilize its physical, academic, and support facilities. This policy is accessible on the college's website athttps://rlacollege.edu.in/college-policies-maintenance-utilisation.php. The procurement of necessary items is guided by recommendations from staff council committees or departments. Once endorsed by the Principal, Infrastructure Committee, in consultation with respective committees/departments and bursar, oversees the implementation. It also reviews complaints, suggestions, and feedback, taking necessary actions with the Principal's approval. The college adheres to the General Financial Rules (GFR) and leverages the Government e-Marketplace (GeM) portal and e-tendering for procurement processes

Daily maintenance for classrooms, furniture, lighting, blackboards, and laboratories, are managed by multi-tasking staff and laboratory personnel within the administration department. An electrician is employed for routine electrical maintenance; plumbing and gardening tasks are assigned to specialized personnel under the Gardening Committee. The college maintains a comprehensive complaint register to address repair and maintenance issues. In prioritizing fire safety, the college has implemented voltage stabilizers, online UPS systems, and strategically placed fire extinguishers. A 160KV silent Electricity Generator with an

Automatic Main Failure (AMF) Panel ensures uninterrupted power supply, overseen by the electrician. Maintenance of internet services, desktops, printers, DG sets, CCTV cameras, intercom systems, and RO systems is facilitated through an Annual Maintenance Contracts (AMC). A professional IT company is entrusted with the responsibility of maintaining and regularly upgrading the college website. A dedicated staff member takes care of routine IT infrastructure maintenance.

Aligned with a Strategic Plan, it focuses on (i) Improving Access to Education and Employability, (ii) Promoting Research, Innovation, and Entrepreneurship, (iii) Fostering Diverse and Inclusive Growth with Social Outreach, and (iv) Enhancing Infrastructure Sustainably. Governance at the college ensures that all academic, extracurricular, and research endeavors align with the institution's vision. The GB, comprising University-nominated members, approves policy implementations. The Principal serves as the member secretary of the GB and as the chairman of the staff council, where faculty responsibilities are assigned

through committees. In regular meetings, departmental leaders, conveners, and committee/society members collaboratively formulate and discuss plans. Faculty members, crucial in student mentorship and activity organization, contribute significantly. Students actively engage in various societies and committees, with feedback from all stakeholders driving continuous improvement. This year marked notable change, with introduction of the four-year program "Undergraduate Curriculum Framework 2022" based on NEP 2020 with a student-centric approach offering a broad range of courses, embodying multidisciplinary and holistic education rooted in Indian cultural ethos. A dedicated committeeand nodal officers coordinated and for successfully implementing the UGCF 2022 curriculum, featuring 12-14 GE, SEC, VAC, and DSE course options. The transition from Class XII exam-based admission to the CUET entrance examination seamlessly admitted 829 undergraduates and 6 postgraduates in Hindi through the admission committee. The college's commitment to adaptability and excellence is evident in these transformative initiatives

College led by the Principal, is supported by a Vice Principal. The Staff Council, composed of all faculty members is chaired by the Principal and convenes regular meetingsfor decisions on administrative and academic matters. Various committees within the Staff Council, such as Admission, Infrastructure, Student Union Advisory, Workload and Academic Affairs, Equal Opportunity Cell, Art and Culture, and others, engage in deliberations and meetings to provide recommendations and take action. Non-teaching staff in the office, library, and labs report to their respective section heads and the Principal. This year in its pursuit to train students to enhance their employability, college offered various add-on skill development certificate courses, training more than 450 students. Besides, diploma in Chinese and Japanese and summer internship programs were started this year for students. We became the first college of Delhi University to start Community Radio "TARANG" aired on FM frequency 90.0, spanning over radius of 10 kms, this unique educational and infotainment channel is made available across the country as Android & I Store app, being one of the most important contributions in the technology space of our college & university. We began airing on `13th Feb 2023. The state-of-the-art studio is specially designed to train budding journalists and make available a platform to our faculty and students both. 62desktop computers, one professional large screen and 9 smartboards have been added this year for teaching learning in addition to other advanced lab equipment. An excellent sports ground is ready with 3 cricket

pitches for Net practice; 2 pitches for tournaments; 1 football ground, 1 volleyball ground and a ground each for kho-kho and kabaddi. Two new Computer Labs with 80 computers capacity, one Yoga and Activity room and a Gym will be added in another six months.

6.2.2 - The functioning of the institutional bodies is effective and efficient as visible from policies, administrative setup, appointment and service rules, procedures, etc.

RLA, Delhi University-maintained institution, with Governing Body (GB) chaired by a nominee of the Vice Chancellor, and its members appointed by the University for a 2-year term. Rotationally, two faculty members; one non-teaching staff are part of GB. Executive decisions are made by GB through its sub-committees. Administrative leadership is under the guidance of Principal, supported by Section Officer (Administration), Bursar, Section Officer (Accounts), support staff. Staff Council, a statutory body, implements GB decisions related to academic, extracurricular, and infrastructural activities through its various committees. The secretary, elected from faculty for one-year term, plays pivotal role in Council, with Principal as Chairman. IQAC plays an important role in enhancing the quality of academics, planning, and administration, establishing and enforcing quality benchmarks. Staff Council committees furnish annual reports to IQAC. Service rules governing Principal, teaching, and nonteaching staff are as per UGC as adopted by the DU. All processes related to admissions, recruitment, Leave, promotion, procurement of equipment, and infrastructure development align with the guidelines set forth by UGC, DU, andGB. Teaching positions are filled as per roster, based on total teacher requirement for each academic session. Non-teaching staff recruitment follows the roster, in accordance with DU rules. Promotions for both teaching and non-teaching staff adhere to the stipulated rules of the University of Delhi. Grievance Redressal Committee addresses concerns from all stakeholders, along with ICC specifically designed to handle cases of sexual harassment. 6.3.5 - Institutions Performance Appraisal System for teaching and non-teaching staff

The College, maintained by the University of Delhi and fully funded by the UGC, adheres to UGC Regulations on Minimum Qualifications for the Appointment of Teachers and other Academic Staff, incorporating amendments over time. The performance

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evaluation of each employee occurs annually through the Annual Performance Appraisal Report (APAR) after one year of service. For the teaching staff, promotions are determined by the Performance-Based Appraisal System (PBAS) and the Academic Performance Indicator (API) Score. Beyond academic responsibilities, faculty members are assigned additional duties, with appropriate weightage factored into their overall assessment. Advance notice is provided to faculty members eligible for promotion, and the filled PBAS proforma is scrutinized by the office, IQAC coordinator, and Principal. Those due for promotion are recommended based on their API score and are required to appear before the screening/selection committee. Non-teaching staff undergo assessment through annual confidential reports and performance appraisal based on specified parameters. The overall evaluation relies on the cumulative grade determined by the Reporting Officer, which is then forwarded to the Principal. Satisfactory performance leads to promotions and financial upgradation under the MACP Scheme for non-teaching employees.

The college meticulously maintains copies of budget proposals, sanctions, invoices, vouchers, and supporting documents for every purchase or event. Original bills are forwarded to the Accounts

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Department, which facilitates payment through RTGS using Tally ERP software. At the end of the financial year, the Accounts Office consolidates and verifies all expenditures and transactions before submitting them for audit.A team of appointed Chartered Accountants thoroughly examines bills, vouchers, books of account, bank statements, etc., highlighting any discrepancies for necessary corrective action. The Chartered Accountants assist in the preparation of balance sheets, which are then approved by the Bursar, Principal, and Treasurer of the Governing Body for final approval and signatures. To ensure adherence to General Financial Rules regarding income and expenditure, an annual external audit is conducted by the office of the Director General of Audit Central Revenues on behalf of the Comptroller and Auditor General (CAG) of India. In the event of audit objections, necessary compliance measures are noted, and the head of the institution is promptly informed for corrective action. Additionally, the University of Delhi periodically conducts internal audits. The audit for the fiscal year 2022-23 was conducted by CAG personnel, Manish Sharma (Senior Audit Officer), Santosh Kumar Jha (Assistant Audit Officer), Kumar Chandra Bhanu Prasad. (Assistant Audit Officer), and Shubham Singh (Senior Auditor), spanning from September 26, 2023, to October 5, 2023, covering a period of 5 days.

6.4.3 - Institutional strategies for mobilization of funds and the optimal utilization of resources

The Grants-in-Aid provided by UGC is allocated to cover expenses of salary and pension of college staff. The Maintenance and General Fund (MGF) primarily supports physical upkeep of the college. Annual fees are directed towards various expenditures, including laboratory maintenance, stationary needs, costs associated with co-curricular activities, and other miscellaneous expenses. The college constitutes a number of committees to ensure efficient resource utilization. Departments submit their requirements to Infrastructure Committee, which evaluates and presents them to Principal for approval. The Library Committee, comprising the librarian, Convener, and teacher in charges, oversees fund allocation, acquisition of books, journals, and periodicals as per requirement submitted by departments. Financial assistance to students in need is facilitated by Fee Concession and Student Aid Fund Committee, based on economic condition and academic performance of student. Staff Council Committees submit budget estimates and advance requirements for planned events to Principal for approval. Funds are disbursed either as advance or against original bills after thorough scrutiny by Section Officer (Accounts) and Bursar, with financial transactions meticulously recorded by the SO-Accounts. Internal and external audits are conducted to ensure transparency and efficiency in financial matters. Research grants received by faculty undergo approval for disbursements by Principal; Utilization certificates and Statements of expenditure are submitted annually to funding agency and at the conclusion of project term by principal investigators. The assetsof projects become part of college resources general pool. Endowment funds are utilized for awards and scholarships granted on annual day as determined by the award committee.

6.5.1 - Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) has contributed significantly for institutionalizing the quality assurance strategies and processes

The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) of RLAC was established in 2017. It conducts regular meetingsto set quality benchmarks and recommend it for implementation based on feedback from all stakeholders. The IQAC has external experts from different fields and senior faculty members. The college IQAC prepares, Annual Quality Assurance Report, proposes new initiatives including certificate courses for students, conducts trainings/workshops/seminars/webinars for teaching and nonteaching staff. For example in 2022-23 IQAC recommended and initiated the process of ISO certification and nominated 11 faculty members from various departments for onsite internal auditor training program. IQAC also initiated the process for NIRF ranking by organising an orientation session for the faculty to give clarity on NIRF parameters. It recommended for constitution ofa committee to look after all social media handles of the college and regularly post the information related to college achievements and events. IQAC discussed the steps to be taken for "Optimum Utilization of College resources" and infrastructural upgradations.

It proposed to purchase ERP system for Attendance, IA, Societies, Placement and Faculty information and screened the vendors for its Implementation from 2023-24. It organised a Workshop on Introduction to Cyber Security for students and staff and Two Days Prashasnik Hindi training programme for non-teaching and teaching staff.

6.5.2 - The institution reviews its teaching learning process, structures & methodologies of operations and learning outcomes at periodic intervals through IQAC set up as per norms and recorded the incremental improvement in various activities

During 2022-23, IQAC spearheaded following transformative initiatives which reflect the college's commitment to holistic education, research, and skill development, fostering an enriched academic environment:

- a. College diligently implemented the Undergraduate Curriculum Framework (UGCF)-2022 in alignment with NEP 2020 adopted by University of Delhi. A committee was established to ensure the seamless incorporation of UGCF 2022, offering students diverse array of Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC), Generic Elective (GE), Value Added Courses (VAC), and Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC) across departments. Notably, Hindi under AEC language was introduced; college joined a cluster of institutions to provide students with additional Indian language options.
- b. College embraced Common University Entrance Test (CUET) scores for undergraduate and postgraduate admissions, admitting 829 students in UG courses and 6 students to PG program in Hindi. Five new Ph.D. students were enrolled under faculty supervision.
- c. Faculty orientation for UGCF-2022 based on NEP through national conference on "NEP 2020: New Trends in Higher Education" with 255 participants. An International Conference on Sustainable Geotourism and more than 42 webinars/seminars/workshops were organised by departments/societies.
- d. College introduced tenadd-on skill development certificate courses, training over 500students, and diploma courses in Chinese and Japanese. A week-long Hands-on workshop titled "Basic Techniques in Microbiology" was held, as part of100-day skill festival in 100year completion of University of Delhi.
- e. Research and IPR cell facilitated Summer Research Internships, benefiting 56 students.
- f. Two-days "Prashasnik Hindi" training programorganized by IQAC and Hindi department for non-teaching staff, attended by 35 participants.

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The institution has effective waste management practices. The Ewaste Management Committee, Solid Waste Management Committee, and Water Management Committee under the Swachhta Action Plan, oversee waste management. There is segregation of biodegradable and nonbiodegradable wast followed by its transport to designated MCD waste boxes. Liquid waste is appropriately disposed of, with nonharmful and sanitation waste directed to the main sewer under constant monitoring. Microbiology department strictly adheres to GLP for biohazardous waste disposal; red bins for proper segregation; Live microbes discarded post-autoclaving andannual contract for biowaste collection. Laboratories refrain from using radioactive materials, and hazardous chemicals are managed according to Material Safety Data Sheets (MSDS). E-waste undergoes disposal through auctioning. Organic waste, including leaf litter and canteen food waste, undergoes in-house composting, producing manure for the college garden. Paper waste is shredded, provided torecycling vendor, who supplies recycled printing paper. Wastewater from a 500-liter/hour reverse osmosis (RO) plant is recycled for washrooms and irrigation. The campus is entirely free of single-use plastic. During 2022-23, the Departments, NCC and NSS conducted cleanliness drives. Under the MoU with Sustainable India Trust underseveralevents including "PARYAV-YEPARVHAI DHARAKA"; Sort the garbage game were conducted to bring awareness in theyouth around the idea of sustainability. Shuchita, TheCleanliness, and Hygiene Society ensuredmaintenance of cleanlinessand hygiene in the college premises.
